So far as reasonably practicable (SFARP)

Victorian Reportable Priority Waste Driver Training > General Environmental Duty (GED) > So far as ... **IN PROGRESS**

The **GED** is a requirement on all individuals performing an activity.

Under s.6 there are some limitations that allow body corporates and individuals performing an activity to remove the risks "so far as reasonably practicable (**SFARP**)".

This relies upon the evidence that a reasonable attempt has been made, with consideration of the following:

- The risks involved:

It's important to take a common-sense approach here – if for example a control was going to cost \$1 million dollars to prevent a spill of 1 litre, then it may not be cost effective. If the cost of an **IB** bund or a concrete bund around a diesel tank near a pristine river then the cost well may be reasonable.
