## Training requirements

This course (training information) is required by your employer to be included in the site induction and training packet to satisfy REG\_G01.

No time limit is considered, but a refresher course every three (3) years is regarded as reasonable.

  - a) Waste codes covered by LGA determination (but not other transfer stations)

# Inside the Course: A Preview of Your A13c Registration Training (Manager Level)

## The law, your obligations and duties

**IMPORTANT:** Legislation surrounding the environment has changed significantly in recent years. If you have been in the industry a long time, it may be different from the last time you looked into legislative requirements.

## What is an A13c registration?

Under the EP Act 2017 (Vic.) any business accepting waste requires a permission from EPA Victoria, unless it's accepted in a declaration of use (DoU) or other special arrangement such as an operating licence.



## Conditions

If a condition in the contract is not met, then the permission holder is in breach of the permission, in this case an A13c registration.

A breach of registration conditions can lead to fines, suspension or revocation of the permission.
